Increase Your Outdoor Privacy



Walls

Solid walls provide the most privacy and look attractive.

Evergreen Hedges

Densely planted evergreens offer privacy and tranquility.

Raised Beds

Add height while creating volume, proportion and privacy.

Japanese Maple:
